<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Freedom to express yourself.</li><li>• Freedom to worship as you wish.</li><li>• Right to a prompt, fair trial by jury.</li><li>• Right to vote in elections for public officials.</li><li>• Right to apply for federal employment requiring U.S. citizenship.</li><li>• Right to run for elected office.</li><li>• Freedom to pursue “life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.”</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Support and defend the Constitution.</li><li>• Stay informed of the issues affecting your community.</li><li>• Participate in the democratic process.</li><li>• Respect and obey federal, state, and local laws.</li><li>• Respect the rights, beliefs, and opinions of others.</li><li>• Participate in your local community.</li><li>• Pay income and other taxes honestly, and on time, to federal, state, and local authorities.</li><li>• Serve on a jury when called upon.</li><li>• Defend the country if the need should arise.</li></ul>
